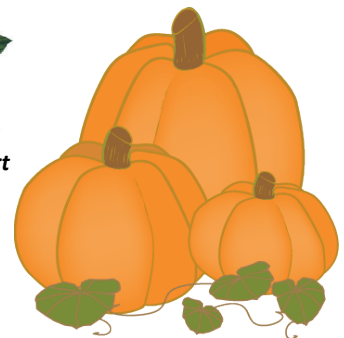

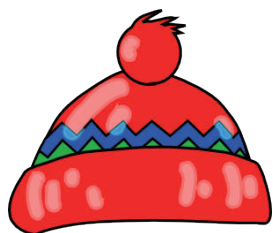
What: Gently used or new Coats (all sizes, including kids) New Scarves, Hats, and Gloves (homemade or store-bought)

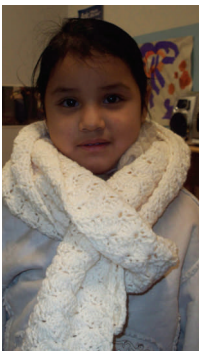
