Prerequisites:

1. B.A. degree
2. Permanent U.S. residency or F1 student visa
3. Fluency in Japanese & English

Eligibility to Teach Japanese

- B.A. degree in Japanese Language with minimum GPA of 2.75
- 3-credit-course, Methods of Teaching a Second Language
- Minimum rating of "Intermediate-High" on the ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview in Japanese.
