Diploma graduates may be eligible for 28 transfer credits in nursing courses. Credits will be awarded if the RN:

1. Has graduated from an accredited nursing program in the last 10 years.
2. Holds a current NJ registered nurse license.
3. Has been admitted to WPU as a matriculated student with an official transcript on file.
4. Has practiced nursing within the last 5 years.
5. Has an earned nursing GPA of at least 2.5 after completing NUR 212 and NUR 218

When the above conditions have been met, the credits will be identified and added to your records.

Should these conditions not be met, further clarification and discussion with the RN Program Coordinator and Chairperson will be mandatory.
