CHARGES FOR UNDERGRADUATE COUNCIL 2006-2007

STANDING CHARGES:

- 1. Recommend policy on undergraduate course requirements for degrees and the procedures for inaugurating, changing or terminating undergraduate course and programs
- 2. Review and recommend new undergraduate programs, major changes in existing programs and undergraduate courses

ISSUES DISCUSSED DURING 2005-2006 IN NEED OF FURTHER STUDY:

- 1. With the Graduate Council, propose mechanisms to streamline the Course Change Proposal Form so that it can be done as an online interactive form
- 2. In cooperation with the GE Committee, hold a campus-wide forum on Best Practices in regard to fulfilling University-wide Student Learning Outcomes

NEW CHARGES:

- 1. Consider the issue of the "same" or very similar courses being offered by two or more departments. Recommend changes in the New Course Approval Form to address this issue. Consider cross-listing as a possible solution. This issue will also be referred to the Graduate Council and to the Advisement and Registration Council.
- 2. Work with College Curriculum Committees and Deans to insure that new Program proposals are received no later than early Spring (Council should set a firm date) in order to allow sufficient time for appropriate review by the Undergraduate Council and by the full Senate
- 3. Work with WAC and TAC to see how these programs can be best integrated Into undergraduate education
