

## WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY TEACH GRANT OPPORTUNITY

**TEACH GRANT**: "A federal grant that provides up to \$4,000 per year to students who agree to teach for four years at an elementary school, secondary school, or educational service agency that serves students from low-income families and to meet other requirements. If the service obligation is not met, the grant is converted to a Direct Unsubsidized Loan." U.S. Department of Education (<u>http://studentaid.ed.gov/</u>) \* \* <u>Note:</u> Due to the Sequester, New TEACH Grant awards will be reduced by 6% (of the award amount for which you would have been eligible), resulting in a maximum award of \$\$3760.

# Seven Steps to Secure and Maintain a TEACH GRANT

- 1. Be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student in one of the appropriate liberal arts or science majors/ education (see list on second page)
- 2. Current undergraduates, incoming freshmen, transfer students and graduate students <u>must have and maintain</u> a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or higher to qualify *(Incoming freshmen may also qualify if they score above the 75th percentile on the SAT)*
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>) Make sure to secure a Personal Identification Number (PIN – <u>www.pin.ed.gov</u>) to sign your FAFSA electronically
- 4. Carefully review the rights and responsibilities of joining the program by accessing the following website https://studentaid.gov/teach-grant-program
- 5. Complete the TEACH Grant Initial Counseling Session and the annual Agreement to Serve (ATS) available online at <a href="https://studentaid.gov/teach-grant-program">https://studentaid.gov/teach-grant-program</a>
- To continue to receive the Teach Grant, students must maintain the required GPA of 3.25 as well as complete the FAFSA, Subsequent Counseling and Agreement to Serve annually
- 7. Access your WPConnect account to review e-mails and ensure the processing of all financial aid. All students who apply for the TEACH Grant will receive an e-mail notification from the William Paterson University Financial Aid Office.
