Keynote Speaker: Catherine Lewis, Ph.D.

Currently a senior research scientist at Mills College, Catherine Lewis comes from several generations of public school teachers. Fluent in Japanese, Catherine has conducted research in Japanese and U.S. schools for 25 years. Her writings and videotapes, including 'Lesson Study: A Handbook of Teacher-Led Instructional Change' and 'Can You Lift 100 Kilograms?' have introduced many U.S. educators to lesson study. A graduate of Harvard University (B.A.) and Stanford University (Ph.D.), she directs the NSF-funded project, 'Lesson Study: Case Studies of an Emerging Reform', and is author of more than 40 publications on elementary education and child development.

Akihiko Takahashi, Ph.D.

Dr. Akihiko Takahashi Is assistant professor of mathematics education at DePaul University. He has more than 20 years of experience in mathematics education including 19 years of teaching in elementary and middle school grades, where he taught all grades from first grade through sixth. He spent most of his teaching career as a member of the mathematics department at the Setagaya Elementary School, affiliated with Tokyo Gakugei University. He received his M.S. and Ph.D. in mathematics education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and his doctoral research focused on using technology in problem solving in middle school mathematics.






Patsy Wang-Iverson, Ph.D.

Dr. Patsy Wang-Iverson is now Director of Special Projects at the Gabriella and Paul Rosenbaum Foundation, having left Research for Better Schools over a year ago. In this capacity, she is continuing her work in disseminating the data from international studies and continuing to learn about lesson study in an international context by working with and listening to teachers and students engaged with lesson study. Representing the U.S. economy, Wang-Iverson participated in the 2006 APEC Conference on mathematical thinking in lesson study in Tokyo and contributed a paper entitled *Developing mathematical thinking through lesson study: Overcoming barriers to effective implementation.* She holds both a master's and doctoral degree in biochemistry from Wake Forest University Medical School.

Tad Watanabe, Ph.D.

Dr. Tad Watanabe is an Associate Professor of Mathematics Education at Kennesaw State University, located just outside of Atlanta. As a native of Japan, Tad was always interested in mathematics education practices in his home country. He spent seven months in Japan during the summer and fall of 2000 and attended more than 15 lesson study open houses and school-based lesson study meetings. His article *Learning from Japanese Lesson Study* appeared in the March 2002 issue of Educational Leadership. Tad has collaborated with lesson study groups in Rochester, NY, Volusia County, FL, and at Public School No. 2 in Paterson, NJ. He received his Ph.D. in mathematics education from Florida State University.
