Requirements for Track II: South Asia (24 credits)

All students must take Civilization of South Asia (ASN 280); 6 credits of Hindi (200-level or higher); and 6 credits of Asian studies electives at the 200 level or higher from any of the other two tracks. The remaining 9 credits may be completed by taking any of the following elective courses:

Requirements for Track III: Asian Languages (24 credits)

Pre-requisite: 12 credits of Chinese, Hindi, or Japanese (110 through 211)—*please note, these credits may not be used toward fulfilling the 24 credits required for the completion of this track*. All students must complete three advanced language courses (221, 222, and 233); two advanced tutorials (310 and 311); and the civilization course that corresponds to the student's selected language, East Asian Civilizations (ASN 270) for Chinese and Japanese, or South Asian Civilization (ASN 280) for Hindi. The remaining 6 credits may be completed by taking any of the following elective courses:

Asian Studies Minor

All students minoring in Asian studies must take Introduction to Asian Studies (ASN 201) and complete a total of 18 credits. Students should select either a multidisciplinary track or an Asian language track for their course of study.

Requirements for a Multidisciplinary Minor

- 6 credits in Asian language, literature, or culture at the 200 level or higher
- 9 credits in Asian Studies electives courses from at least two different disciplines.

Requirements for an Asian Language Minor

- 6 credits of intermediate Chinese, Hindi, or Japanese language courses (210 and 211)
- 9 credits of advanced Chinese, Hindi, or Japanese language courses (221, 222, and 223)
