

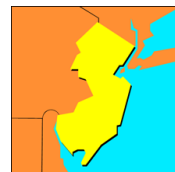

The position requires the following skills:

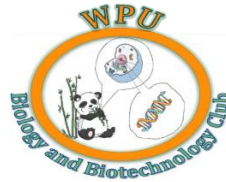
