**Two standing charges:**

1. Review and recommend new graduate programs and the procedures for inaugurating, changing, or terminating graduate courses and programs.
2. Review and recommend new graduate programs, major changes in existing programs, and areas of expansion.

**Two additional charges requested:**

1. Discuss the “Online Integrity and Standards” policy with the Technology Council and the Graduate Policies Council and bring recommendations to the Senate.
2. Consider the creation of a university-wide thesis policy.

## **Summary of Accomplishments:**

### Programs Reviewed:

#### New Program:

- Certificate Program: New 21 credit certificate program in Special Education with a concentration in autism spectrum disorders and other severe disorders.
- Master's in Public Health (Concentration – Health Communication)

#### Change in Existing Program:

- MFA in Creative and Professional Writing – Admission requirement change
- MA in Professional Communication: Curriculum change
- Master's in Counseling: Curriculum change
- Master's in Nursing: Admission requirement change

### Online Integrity and Standards

- Shared our recommendations for the Online Program Policy developed by Graduate Policy Council.
- Developed Online Program Best Practice Checklist based on the “Five Pillar” Model suggested in *Policies and Procedure for Developing and Maintaining the Integrity of Online Programs* prepared by Faculty Senate Graduate Policy Council. The draft of checklist has shared with Graduate Policy Council and Technology Council for their inputs.

### University-wide Thesis Policy

- Visited the library and had a quick workshop about the Thesis Process (Jane Bambrick and Leah Marie Zamora)
- Question on if there should be minimum university standards for the masters from WPU because of departmental variations.
- This charge needs to be discussed with Graduate Program Policy.

- Review and recommend new graduate programs, major changes in existing programs, and areas of expansion.
- Work on “Online Integrity and Standards” for ensuring academic integrity in graduate programs that are offered completely online and make recommendations to the Senate.
