Documentation of High School Completion Status

Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review. The law states that before finalizing Federal Student Aid, the Financial Aid Office must confirm your **High School Completion Status**.

Provide one of the following documents to the **Financial Aid Office** that indicates the student's high school completion status at the beginning of this academic year.

- A copy of the student's high school diploma.
- A copy of the student's <u>final official</u> high school transcript that shows the date when the diploma was awarded.
- A copy of the student's General Educational Development (GED) certificate or GED transcript.
- An academic transcript that indicates the student successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree.
- If State law requires a homeschool student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschooled (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a copy of that credential.
- If State law does not require a homeschooled student to obtain a secondary school completion credential for homeschool (other than a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent), a transcript or the equivalent, signed by the student's parent or guardian, that lists the secondary school courses the student completed and documents the successful completion of a secondary school education in a homeschooled setting.

It is <u>your</u> responsibility to provide this documentation to the Financial Aid Office even if this documentation has been submitted to the Admissions Office.
