Evidence for increased demand for graduates in this field was demonstrated by the Bureau of Labor Statistics which has projected employment in this field to increase over the next several years by 5 to 6 percent. Geographically, the region of metropolitan New York and northern New Jersey is in list of the top ten areas nation-wide for the availability of jobs for 	B. P. S. Chauhan has incorporated a page with admission criteria. The budget page will be revised to include funds for marketing and recruitment. The Library materials budget will be increased by \$500 for the initial year and 10% for each subsequent year.

materials chemists, and two additional regions, Philadelphia and Boston, are both within close proximity to New Jersey. The continuing need for graduates in this field was also documented with several letters from leading materials manufacturers. B. P. S. Chauhan also mentioned that the faculty currently work with the undergraduate chemistry majors to deliver successful presentations at professional and academic conferences and to publish articles in peerreviewed journals. They intend to continue this activity with the graduate students. Physically, the department has adequate laboratory space in Science West. They already have most of the equipment needed and have budgeted for service contracts for the equipment. In addition, the department has one lab technician. The department is accredited by the American Chemical Society. The members commented on some issues: • K. Louie asked about admission criteria (via email) and a page was added with detailed criteria. R. Kashyap asked about marketing strategy and recruitment plans. S. Sabatino asked if the amount budgeted for library resources would be adequate for a graduate program.
