He began his legal career in New Orleans, first as a staff attorney for the **Juvenile Justice Project** of Louisiana and later as a defense attorney and founding member of **Juvenile Regional Services**. He received his J.D. from New York University School of Law and his Bachelor's degree from Harvard University.
