## STEPS TO FORMAL TEACHER CANDIDACY:

Students with 18 or more credits may take ANTH 2020. Before a student can take the first education course, CIED 2030, the following must be completed:

- 1. Successfully complete ANTH 2020 and PSY 1100 General Psychology, both with a minimum grade of C.
- 2. Pass the CORE Academic Skills for Educators praxis (ETS test code: 5751), AND pass the Speech and Hearing Assessments. Information can be found at: http://www.wpunj.edu/coe/departments/cert/
- 3. Declare an appropriate liberal arts or sciences major.
- 4. Complete at least 60 college level credits.
- 5. Achieve a cumulative 3.0\* GPA or higher.

### **CONTINUING IN THE MAJOR:**

- 1. Successfully complete all UCC courses in Areas 1-4 and required courses for education before beginning the practicum semester (Semester III).
- 2. Maintain a 3.0\* overall cumulative GPA to be recommended to the state for certification.
- 3. Maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA in your education courses to be permitted to student teach.
- 4. Apply for a substitute teacher's license as soon as 60 credits are completed. Obtain the license before the Semester II Field Placement.
- 5. The CISE 3520 Practicum Package and Student Teaching (Semesters III and IV) should be the last two semesters before graduation. Candidates are advised to take no more than one additional course with the practicum package.
- 6. Candidates are not permitted to enroll in more than one additional course during student teaching.
- 7. The PRAXIS II test in your subject area, must be passed before entering student teaching. It is the student's responsibility to submit a copy of the results to the University. Official passing scores must be received by the Office of Field Experiences by August 1st to student teach in the fall semester and by January 1st to student teach in the spring semester. There are no exceptions to these deadlines.

### FIELD EXPERIENCE APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Practicum and Student Teaching: Apply every Fall (October 15) for placement the next Fall and every Spring (March 15) for placement the next Spring. \*Students who were fully matriculated as education majors before August 31, 2014 must have and maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 in order to take education courses. As of September 1, 2016, a cumulative GPA of 3.0 will be required for certification. This means that students with a cumulative GPA of less than 3.0 must graduate and be recommended for certification before September 1, 2016.

## BILINGUAL INSTRUCTIONAL ENDORSEMENT PROGRAM – 12 Credits

This program reflects the importance of field experiences with bilingual students and is coordinated with existing field work in your Education major. Candidates for this endorsement will be required to do either their practicum placement or their student teaching in a bilingual setting. Observations and other clinical experiences will include bilingual classrooms.

Required Courses: This endorsement program is comprised of 12 credits at the 2000, 3000, and 4000 levels:

College of Humanities and Social Sciences (6 credits)

ENG 4010: Linguistics and Grammars (3)

TBED 3420: Cross-linguistic Approach to Bilingual Development /Bilingualism) (3)

College of Education (6 credits)

CIED 2050: Foundations of Bilingual and Multicultural Ed. (3) CIED 3050:Teaching Methods for English Language Learners(3)

These courses cover the following five state-required content areas: Linguistics; Language Acquisition; Developing Literacy Skills; Methods of Teaching Content in Bilingual Education; and Theory and Practice of Bilingual Education. Language Proficiency Testing: Candidates must pass oral and written language proficiency tests (OPI and WPT) in English and in the target language. The English OPI must be passed with a score of at least Intermediate High. The English WPT must be passed with a score of at least Advanced Low. The OPI and WPT in the target language must be passed with a score of at least Advanced Low. These requirements must be met before student teaching begins.
