The college of humanities and social sciences invites applications for the following six tenure-track positions in the Departments of English, History, Psychology, and Sociology to begin September 2008.

English. Specialization in Creative Writing, especially fiction, creative non-fiction, and multi-genre writing courses. Ph.D. preferred; M.F.A considered. Relevant publications and teaching experience required. Teach a variety of specialized undergraduate and graduate writing courses, as well as general education courses. History. Specialization in Modern Latin American History, with the ability to teach Brazilian History, Mexican History, and the Spanish Caribbean. Ph.D. required. Successful candidate will also teach in and serve Latin American and Latino Studies Program. Psychology. Two positions. Position 1: Ph.D. in **experimental psychology** with preference given to candidates with backgrounds in cognitive, perception, or neuropsychology. Ability to teach statistics and research methods required. Position 2: Ph.D. in **counseling psychology**; specialization in health psychology preferred; licensed or license eligible preferred. Ability to teach graduate counseling and clinical courses as well as undergraduate courses. Sociology. Two positions. Teaching will include a combination of introductory, methods or theory courses, statistics, and substantive specialty areas. Position 1: Specialization in Criminal Justice/Criminology. Position 2: Specialization in Social Services. Sub-specialties in globalization or in issues affecting Latinos, African-, or Asian-Americans preferred. The successful candidate must hold a doctoral degree in sociology, criminology/criminal justice or related field for Position One, and in social

work for Position Two, and must demonstrate potential for both research and teaching.
