**Abstract**: The Chaucer Guild is the Oldest Poetry Society in New

Jersey. This collection is only but a small amount of the material that was produced during seventy-five years of its existence. The material contained in this collection provides a wonderful running narrative of a small group of poets through photographs, letters,

newsletters and various collections of poems.

### **Biographical Sketch**

The Chaucer Guild was originally organized as the Mittru Chapter of the Chaucer Guild in 1930 by James Gabelle. A small group of six citizens from Paterson New Jersey met in November 1930 to form what would eventually become the oldest poetry society in New Jersey. Present at the meeting was Gabelle, Louis Ginsberg, Frances Hamilton Archer, Isabelle V. Hayward, Christie Jeffries and John Piekema. The purpose of The Chaucer Guild is to promote the writing of good poetry, appreciate fine poetry and to encourage young upcoming poets.

In 1935 the Guild officially changed its name to *The Chaucer Guild*, but the stated purposes of the Guild never changed. The Guild published four anthologies; *Blue Shadow* (1935), *This Fair Company* (1970), *Feathers Glittering as Gold* (1981), *Pilgrims Passing Through* (1985) and *The Chaucer Guild Anthology for 2004-2005* (2005).

### **Scope and Content Note**

The photographs in the collection cover the years 1930-1989. The pictures were mostly taken during meetings of the Guild, and are both formal and informal in their content. The news clippings cover the entire span of the Guilds existence and give a fine narrative of the ongoing events of the poetry society. Printed invitations are an example of the events and activities sponsored by the Guild. They illustrate the range and scope of the organization, and provide a chronology of activities.

Special Note: Included within The Chaucer Guild collection is a series of four photographs of Louis Ginsberg and his family (including Allen Ginsberg). Louis Ginsberg was a founding member of the Chaucer Guild and his son, Allen Ginsberg was a prominent Beat Generation poet during the later half of the Twentieth Century.

The photographs, news clippings, invitations, correspondences and schedules of The Chaucer Guild are separated into two folders; one folder is labeled **The Chaucer Guild**, **1930 – 1969**, and the other is labeled **The Chaucer Guild**, **1970 – 2005**.
