Change in Probation Policy

Policy

If at any time, a student's grade point average falls below a 3.0, the student is automatically placed on probation and the maximum number of credits in which a student can enroll will be nine credits; if a student's cumulative GPA remains below 3.0, but the student has achieved a GPA of 3.25 or higher in the semester, the student will be allowed to register for an additional nine credits. If a student has not attained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, and a GPA of 3.25 in the semester, the student will be dismissed from the University. A student must, however, attain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher by the final semester of matriculation which is consistent with University policy.

No individual Program may have more restrictive policies unless reviewed and approved by the office of the Provost.

Maximum Time to Degree Completion

POLICY

The master's degree, certification, or endorsement program must be completed within a period of six years from the time the student matriculates. Doctoral programs must be completed within a period of eight years from the time the student matriculates. The time to completion includes leaves of absences, withdrawals, capstone requirements, and comprehensive examinations. The appropriate college dean must approve requests for extension of time.

3. Course Repeat Policy: Review and recommend policies and procedures governing repeating a course.
4. Review and recommend policies and procedures for developing, identifying, and coordinating resources for increasing enrollment in our low enrollment programs.
5. Review and recommend policies and procedures for developing a “Graduate Support Network (GSN)”: A WPU-based group of academics and professionals committed to the idea of supporting graduate students and diversity through mentorship and academic support.
