## **Accomplishments and Summary of Activities**

## **Programs Reviewed**

The Council members reviewed ten graduate programs and approved the rationale for a change to all graduate certificate programs. These programs are listed below.

The Council also approved a change to all graduate certificate programs. This change was approved by the Faculty Senate on January 24, 2017.

Description: William Paterson University packages graduate courses necessary for students to qualify for certifications and endorsements but, in most instances, does not grant a credential to students completing these sets of courses. The purpose of this change was to create a graduate certificate for each of these programs. The certificate would be awarded to all students who complete a specific set of courses leading to an endorsement or certification. The proposal was for the University to grant graduate certificates for a number of programs across multiple colleges. Some of these programs are offered collaboratively between two or more departments and some are not. Many of these programs are in the graduate curriculum of the College of Education.

Currently, students are enrolled in these programs as non-degree students and do not qualify for most forms of financial aid and subsidized student loans. In some cases, the granting of a graduate certificate may resolve this issue for students. Also, granting a credential for these programs will allow the programs to be listed in the program inventory for the State on New Jersey.

# **Additional Charge**

Progress: Contacted the chair of the Technology Council, David Fuentes, regarding this additional charge since the Technology Council has this area as their main charge. We shared our document "Best Practices Checklist for Online Programs" with the members of the Technology Council, and will incorporate their suggestions into a revised document.

## **Additional Charge**

• Present the council suggestions for Academic Change Proposal form to the Faculty Senate

Progress: On April 26, we met with the members of the Undergraduate Council and Jonathan Lincoln, Associate Provost for Curriculum and International Education, to discuss the suggested revisions for this form. The suggested revisions, in addition to other changes, will be incorporated into a new online form which should be in use during the fall semester. It is anticipated that there will be a period of transition during which both the paper and online forms will be in use. During the fall semester, further revisions can be made to the online form if needed. It is expected that by spring 2018, all program changes and new programs will be submitted using the online form.

### Priorities for 2017-2018

The council plans to follow-up on the revisions to the document "Best Practices Checklist for Online Programs" and to review the online academic change proposal form to determine if further additions or modifications should be suggested.
