 - b. Gilley: CSH had a separate meeting to discuss OA, but attendance was low.

- 4. Research & Scholarship Week
 - Martin, Pam, and Jorge met with the Provost and Stuart Goldstein to talk about branding the activities that will fall under the umbrella of Research & Scholarship. Stuart will take the project back to his department for ideas.
 - b. The group also suggested that there be 2 publications one a summary program or brochure used as promotional material and another comprehensive one as a "conference proceedings."

 - e. There will be an open call for Posters, but the sessions will be sponsored by the Colleges. This is intended to help increase attendance of faculty and students.
