Criminology is the scientific study of the nature, extent, causes, and consequences of crime as well as responses to crime. Criminal justice science is the study of official responses to crime in the areas of law, policing, courts, corrections, and treatment and advocacy. Our BA in criminology and criminal justice provides the knowledge and skills needed to be proficient in both fields and prepares students to enter a wide range of criminology and criminal justice-related occupations.
