Marta Rivera de la Cruz, Spanish journalist and writer, has won important literary prizes such as “Premio Ateneo Joven” de Sevilla, and was finalist to the Planeta prize with her acclaimed novel *En tiempo de prodigios*. Her journalistic trajectory has also been recognized with the “Premio de Periodismo Puro Cora”. She collaborates with the *El País Semanal*, one of the most important Spanish newspapers, and she also participates in a radio program, *Al sur de la semana*, Cadena Cope. Rivera de la Cruz will be exploring the role of Spanish migration to Latin America and return through one of its most representative real and literary types: the “indiano”

The series is organized by the Latin American and Latino Studies Program, the Spanish Program, and funded by a grant from the Tinker Foundation, which promotes the development of an equitable, sustainable and productive society in

Latin America.
