The Safe Walk Program will be available during finals. Anyone requesting an escort on campus should call 973.720.7400. Safe Walk service hours and times are Monday through Thursday, 8:00pm to 12:30am.

Members of Student Patrol will be stationed at the Student Center. Upon request, they will escort you to your destination. Student Patrol will be wearing jackets marked

Student Patrol, blue t-shirts and black pants. All Student Patrol will be displaying their University identification. Student Patrol workers are in direct communication with University Police Headquarters, which will be contacted should a problem arise.

Missing Person

If you believe that a person you know is missing, please contact University Police at 973.720.2300 to report the person missing. Upon calling, the Communication's Officer will ask you for certain information. That information generally consists of the following: name of missing person, reason you believe the person is missing, last time you had contact with the person, where the person lives if known, telephone number if known and any specific information about the person, such as the type of car the person drives. Please provide the Officer with as much information as possible.

Medical or Psychiatric Emergencies

In the event that you or a person near you is experiencing a medical or psychiatric emergency, please feel free to call University Police for assistance. The Counseling Center also provides twenty-four hour/seven days a week emergency/crisis intervention, as well as regularly scheduled appointments.
