## **Study Abroad in the Netherlands**

**May 19 – June 2, 2017**

1. Stay in Windesheim University dorms in Zwolle (two people per room.).
2. Meals on your own. Dorm kitchen or local restaurants
3. Take 6 summer credits. Undergraduate credits in UCC Area 1 and or 6. Also Elementary, Secondary or Special Education.
  - Courses will continue online after the class sessions in Zwolle
  - Courses are taught by WPU faculty
  - Visit schools, local attractions
4. Travel to campus, local villages, by bicycle
5. Explore Amsterdam or Paris on your own over the weekend.



**Reserve with a deposit of \$250 by February 13, 2017.  
(Non-refundable after 2/13)**

Estimated local costs are \$1,250 (subject to change): Deposit (\$250) can be used towards room (\$400) and bicycle rental (\$100). Meals (\$350 - \$450) local transportation (\$200). **This does not include airfare (\$950-\$1400); WPU Tuition (per WPU website)**

Provide proof of valid passport and health insurance, complete required university forms.

Make your own flight arrangements. (You may travel with the advisors 5/19-6/2.) Arrive no later than May 21<sup>th</sup> and depart June 2<sup>th</sup>. Students may choose to stay in Europe and travel on their own after the program.

Register for two (or three) of the following courses:

- b. DIS 4090 Disability in a Global Society (UCC 6)
- c. SPC 3540 (CISE/PSY 2950; CIEE 3110; CIEC 3100)
