Dr. Alejandro Anreus is professor of art history and Latin American/Latinx Studies at William Paterson University since September of 2001. Previously he was curator of exhibitions and collections at the Jersey City Museum (1993-2001) and the Montclair Art Museum (1986-1993). In 1993 he received the Nancy Hanks Award for curatorial excellence from the American Association of Museums for his advocacy of African American Art; the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Center for Latino Arts and Culture, Rutgers University in 2002; and the Latino Book Award for an Art Book in English for "Luis Cruz Azaceta" in 2015. He is the author of many books including, "Orozco in Gringoland" (2001); "Ben Shahn and the Passion of Sacco and Vanzetti" (2001); "Mexican Muralism. A Critical History" (2012); and the forthcoming "Blackwell Companion to Modern and Contemporary Latin American and Latina/o Art" (2022). Last September he held a keynote virtual conversation with curator Barbara Haskell at the Whitney Museum of American Art; the audience consisted of 700 members of the public.
