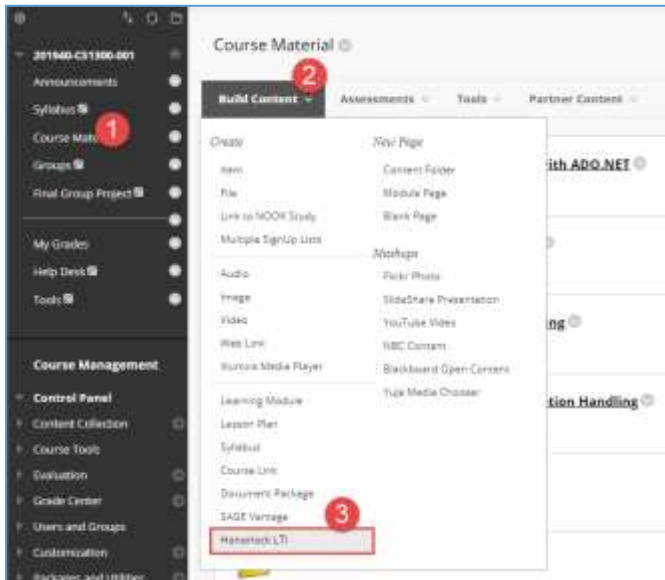
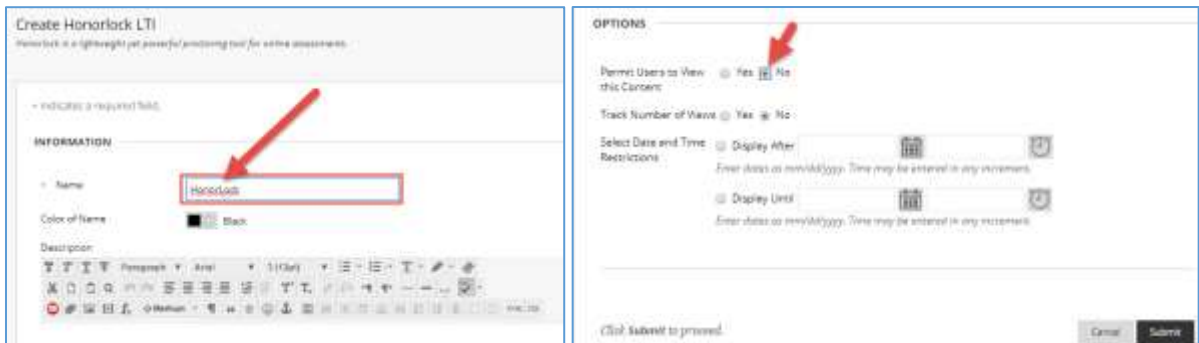


Setting up HonorLock in a Course

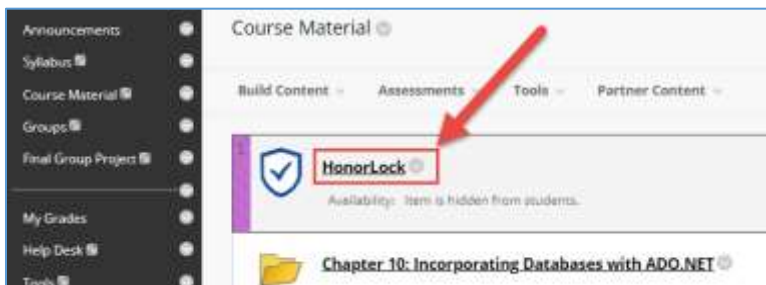
1. Navigate to the page of your course that you want to put the exam on. Under Build Content or Tools, select Honorlock LTI.



2. Enter the following information into the LTI creation form: Name: Honorlock Description (optional): Honorlock online remote proctoring. Permit Users to View this Content: No Note: this is important as it limits the LTI to faculty use only (as intended) Track Number of Views: No Select Date and Time Restrictions: None

Enable HonorLock in an Assessment

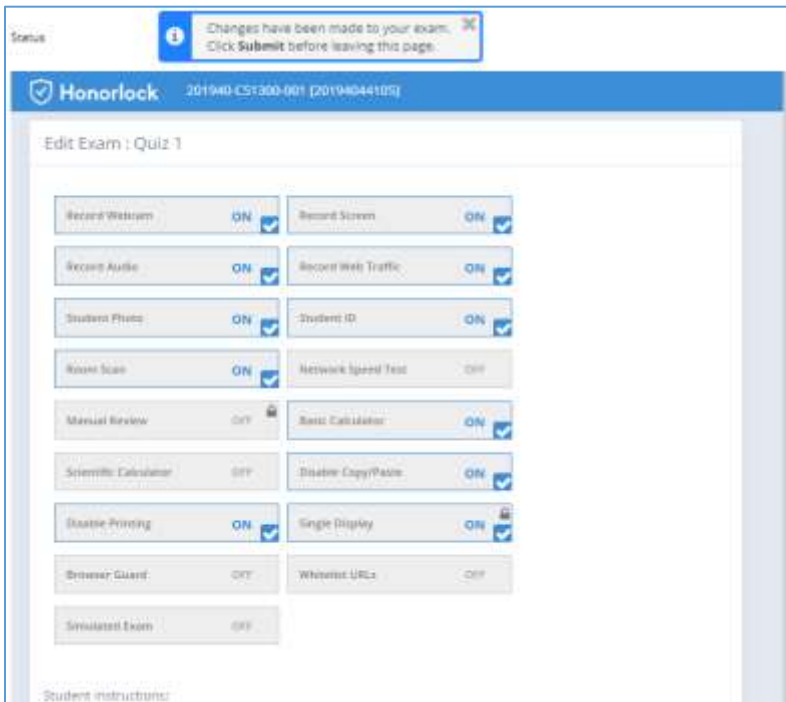
1. Once there is an assessment in your course content menu, navigate to the test options by clicking on the down arrow symbol to the right of the assessment name. Click on the symbol to open up the context menu, and then select **Edit the Test Options**.



2. Navigate to the Honorlock section of the test options, and select **Click to Enable** to enable Honorlock in your assessment.



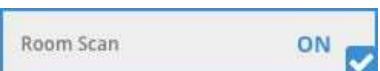
3. Make changes on the proctoring options below by clicking each. When you made all changes, press Submit button.

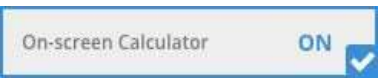


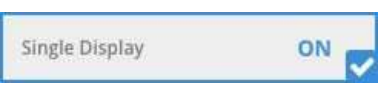
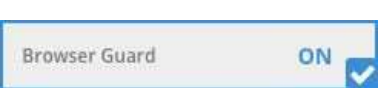



Your assessment is now enabled with Honorlock and ready for Honorlock proctoring!



Explanation of Proctoring Options

Feature	Feature Description	Honorlock Recommendation
	Student's webcam will be recorded during the exam session.	<i>Recommended</i>
	If this option is enabled and the student webcam feed fails, we will not interrupt their exam session and they will essentially be able to continue unproctored.	<i>Not Recommended</i>
	Student's entire screen will be recorded throughout the exam session.	<i>Recommended</i>
	Student's audio environment will be recorded during the exam session.	<i>Recommended</i>
	All internet activity will be monitored during the exam session.	<i>Recommended</i>
	During the verification process, a photo will be taken of the student's face to verify the test-taker's identity.	<i>Recommended</i>
	During the verification process, a photo will be taken of the student's school ID (or other government issued ID) to verify the test-taker's name and identity.	<i>Recommended</i>
	During the verification process, students will rotate their camera 360 degrees, scanning their room and desk area to ensure no unauthorized people or materials are in the testing environment.	<i>Recommended</i>
	Before the verification process, have the student run a network speed test to ensure they meet the network requirements to take an Honorlock enabled exam.	<i>Recommended</i>
	Our human review proctoring staff will manually review all of the student videos and flag any suspicious behaviors and deviations from test guidelines.	<p><i>Note:</i> <i>This is an additional service.</i> <i>Check with your institution for availability.</i></p>

	<p>On-screen basic calculator.</p>	<p><i>Recommended When Needed</i></p>
	<p>Students will not be able to copy, paste, or right click in Canvas during the exam. This helps to prevent the unauthorized distribution of test content.</p>	<p><i>Recommended</i></p>
	<p>Students will be prevented from printing the test pages during the exam session. This helps to prevent the unauthorized distribution of test content.</p>	<p><i>Recommended</i></p>
	<p>Students will have to disconnect any additional displays (such as dual monitors) to ensure only one screen is in use.</p>	<p><i>Recommended</i></p>
	<p>Locks down the student's browser to ensure they cannot open new tabs, windows, or applications during the exam.</p>	<p><i>Recommended for closed book exams that don't require additional applications</i></p>
	<p>Allows faculty to give students permission to visit specific websites while restricting them from visiting any other website during the exam session.</p>	<p><i>Recommended</i></p>
