Notes:

1. William Paterson University will accept all associate degree credits under this program-to-program articulation agreement, including up to half of the William Paterson University major required credits, from New Jersey community college students who enroll at William Paterson University
2. William Paterson University recommends students take two semesters of one foreign language at the community college. Two semesters of American Sign Language can also fulfill the foreign language requirement.
3. WP Online students should always check with their advisor and/or refer to the semester course schedule when choosing electives, as elective course offerings may vary each semester.
4. Note: the applied lesson sequence at WP should start at MUSP 1920. At some point, the WP faculty may decide to move a student ahead in the sequence. Typically, this happens after the student has passed the sophomore proficiency exam. Either way, the student will skip two semesters of lessons so they can finish in 9 semesters total. (Please note that if a student isn't practicing and falls behind in lessons this may necessitate a tenth semester.)
