Secondary Education (K-12)

A secondary education major has a passion to teach a specific subject and wishes to only teach that subject during the school day. Most teachers of a particular subject field find jobs in high schools, middle schools, and junior high schools. Some can find jobs spanning all grade levels, including those certified to teach art, music, languages, or physical education.

What are the requirements to begin your education coursework for teacher certification?

Prior to beginning education courses:

- Select an appropriate major/concentration
- Earn 60 credits
- Take pre-requisite coursework
- Achieve a 3.00 GPA minimum (NJ requirement)
- Meet Basic Skills Qualifying Scores: PRAXIS CORE, ACT, or SAT (NJ requirement)
- Complete Criminal background check & fingerprinting
- Complete Assessment of Professional Dispositions





- What are the requirements for program completion and to become a certified teacher in NJ?
 - PRAXIS Subject Assessment and 3.0 GPA demonstrate content knowledge
 - edTPA and clinical practice assessments demonstrate teaching skills and dispositions
 - Successful completion of program and degree requirements
