

This community is geared towards career exploration and personal reflection, and will help you learn more about who you are and discover career paths that are fit for you.



- University Core Curriculum (40 credits)
- Major requirements (60 69 credits)
- World language requirement (can be waived)
- 4 Writing-Intensive courses (can double-count)
- 2 Technology-Intensive courses (can double-count)

Transfers on course-by-course basis

<u>Degree Requirements</u> for Transfer Students with Completed AA/AS

The Degree consists of 120 credits total:

- Major requirements (60 69 credits)
- World language requirement (can be waived)
- 1 Writing-Intensive course 3000/4000 level (can double-count)
- Prerequisites for major courses
