HOW I FOUND MY CLIINICAL SITE," TIPS!! (Nurse Liz) (P.S. No rule exists requiring schools to find placement).

b) What type of site am I looking for?

PRIMARY CARE SITES! You are in a primary care program – not an acute care program, not an emergency care program or any speciality, i.e. infectious disease, hospitalist, pulmonary, etc. You are looking for primary care clinics, private practices, practices associated with hospitals, etc. (YOU ARE NOT GOING TO HOSPITALS. YOU ARE NOT ROUNDING IN HOSPITALS. YOU ARE NOT GOING TO OR'S, CATH LABS, ETC. YOU ARE IN A PRIMARY CARE PROGRAM. IN ADDITION: no medi spas, no botox, IV ketamine, etc.

SPECIALTY SITES (cardiac, pulmonary, GI, etc) are limited to 50 hours, the rest 120 hrs must be in a second true PRIMARY CARE SITE.

c) Where do I find these sites?

COLD CALL This means you are randomly walking into a site.	Dress Professionally! Be polite! SHORT LETTER - Compose a short, thoughtfully composed letter that says something like "Hello, I am hoping you can help me. I am a graduate nursing student in the Master's Nursing Program at Fairleigh Dickinson University. I am looking to find a preceptor/placement site for my upcoming graduate course focusing on in the semester, which runs from to I need to complete hours during this time. I can appreciate the extra effort needed to both precept a student while also keeping pace with your patient volume. I recognize this and want to assure you that I am a motivated graduate student with a skill set that will help with your patient throughput. I am happy to work around any schedule that fits your practice needs. In advance, I am thankful for any consideration. I can be reached at Sincerely,"	DO NOT ASK TO SPEAK TO ANY PROVIDER (i.e. MD/NP) (they are busy seeing patients) The Office Manager / Practice Manager usually makes these decisions.	Let the front desk person know you are looking for a site and ask if they could deliver your note to the appropriate person who makes these decisions. (This is usually the Office Manager). ALSO , POLITELY ASK FOR THE NAME AND EMAIL OF THE OFFICE MANAGER IF they say they don't take students, then just thank them and leave Otherwise, leave the note and thank them sincerely. Make a list of who you have called and where you have gone. Follow up your visit with an email to the office manager — again make it brief, quickly restate your class, needs, etc. Sell your strong skills, experience, understand pt flow, etc. (See the utube video).

2. WHAT DO I DO ONCE I FIND A SITE?

a) Fill out the form in EXXAT by the deadline due date:

Go to the eplacement site in EXXAT – make sure you choose the correct course and the correct semester

Fill out all the required information – completely and accurately. In advance, you need to know the name, credentials, email, phone number (site phone number) and site address for the person who will accept responsibility and sign off on the Letter of Agreement. Fill this information out correctly (be sure to use capitalization and full names etc.)

b) DEADLINES – you must submit by the deadlines posted in Student Handbooks and PP info posted on WP website.

3. WHAT ELSE DO I NEED?

NP STUDENT MALPRACTICE INSURANCE: (note \$\$ subject to change)

You will need student NP malpractice insurance. Call your current RN Malpractice organization and ask them to add this. It is not overly expensive. You must have this before you start. Here is some additional information:

NSO* - \$ 330 for both RN and NP Student – w \$25, 000-license protection Occurrence made (no tail required)

Pro Liability *\$ 150- 350/400 (if coverage as RN via employer then \$150 for backup/secondary as RN & NP Student - Otherwise \$350 - \$400

Other insurers of RNs also provide NP student malpractice - check w them

EXXAT FORMS COMPLETED - See EXXAT (ie Physical Exam form, Vaccination records/titres etc)

4. WHEN CAN I START?

You may start once ALL YOUR EXXAT info has been approved which includes a signed confirmation email agreement by your Preceptor – and you have met ALL the requirements listed in EXXAT. BE SURE to review the to see if you have any outstanding issues. IF you have completed all requirements then this is a GO, and you can start when your class officially starts (legal reasons) and once the site says you can start. You may not start sooner than the class starts.
