- Payroll/Benefits (Ramzi Chabata): October is open enrollment for health and dental programs; a new company will manage the prescription drug plan; two information sessions are planned; October 31 is the last day to make a change; the NJ Charitable Campaign is underway
- 2. University Performing Arts (Jane Stein): Food For Thought, Concert for Peace, and Russian string ensemble events are upcoming
- 3. Financial Aid (Michael Corse): FAFSA opened on October 1st; students can complete the 18-19 FAFSA using 2016 tax information and can use the IRS "data retrieval" process; TAG students have a March 15 deadline; Kiosks are available outside the Financial Aid Office for FAFSA input
- 4. Health, Counseling and Wellness (Jill Guzman): The center is billing for medical services to obtain revenue from insurance and will bill out-of-network. The goal is to be able to have revenue so the center can continue to provide the quality of care. This does not affect mental health services.
- 5. DC Scholarship Update (Spencer Scott): Last year's scholarship recipient is currently interning with the NY Giants; the council voted to proceed with the scholarship this year; selection of this year's recipient is being finalized; members are able to make confidential donations towards the goal of \$1000.00 (minimum)
- 6. Campus Activities (Donna Minnich Spueller and Ugonma Chukwemyene): Charity drive (Hearts for Hurricane) is currently in effect, with all proceeds going to Unicef; "Our Collective Voices" will be a yearlong celebration of diversity, sponsored by the Latin X group
