Garden State Partnership for Teacher Quality Program

If you hold a bachelor's degree and are interested in becoming a teacher in a high needs urban school, consider William Paterson University's Garden State Partnership for Teacher Quality (GSPTQ) Program.



Through this rigorous, 18-month program, you have the opportunity to earn:

- your teaching certification in elementary education (may be combined with middle school) or secondary education with an endorsement in special education, bilingual education, or English as a second language (ESL); and
- the M.Ed. in special education with a concentration in Teacher of Students with Disabilities; or
- the M.Ed. in curriculum and learning with a concentration in bilingual/ESL education.

As part of this 18-month program, participants receive a \$30,000 stipend, funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Education, while completing a one-year residency in a professional development school.
