Grants:

Transition to Teaching: New Vistas

- 5 year grant from USDOE
- 55 candidates a year (4 Cohorts) Dual Certification
- Partners: WPU, Kean, East Orange, Elizabeth, Paterson
- Total Grant Award: \$3.04 million

Garden State Partnership for Teacher Quality

- Funding: USDOE Teacher Quality Partnership-- 5 years
- Partners: WPU, Kean & Rowan Universities
- Districts: Paterson, Passaic, Bridgeton, Camden, Jersey City
- 5 urban teacher residents per year, per IHE
- Reforming Pre-Baccalaureate programs
- PDSs PDS Conference May 25th
- Total Award: \$10.8 million (2009-2014)

Sheltered English Professional Development

- One year grant from the NJDOE
- 50 participants from surrounding school districts
- 4 day intensive seminars, follow-up sessions, classroom observations
