<u>Course description:</u> A course for non-art majors addressing selected issues in the visual arts. Emphasis is placed on visual literacy, teaching students how to speak, write, and think about art. Course content may address a variety of historical periods and visual media, including painting, sculpture, architecture, graphic arts, photography, and film. **Please note: this class involves a minimum of one museum or gallery visit.

Course Objectives:

- To engage students in active viewing and critical discussion about visual media, using both the vocabulary and concepts of the discipline.
- To introduce students to basic themes in the study of human artistic production and reception.
- To teach students to speak and write clearly and eloquently on any topic, using the visual arts as a means to that end.

This course is conducted online, utilizing Blackboard, so you **MUST** be familiar with the basics of that application. You must also regularly check your **WPU email accounts**, as that will be the primary means of communication.

This class will be asynchronous, meaning that you will complete assignments at your own pace and upload them by the given deadlines. **Specific due-dates and times are listed below.**
