Resources for Funding Such As:

■ TEACH Grants

Towards math, science, or foreign language certifications or those pursuing the TSD or bilingual endorsements. Must commit to working 4 years in a school district of need or must re-pay as a loan. Conditions apply.

■ NOYCE Grant *Dr. Djanna Hill* HillD@wpunj.edu

Pursuing math or science licenses. National Science Foundation funding. Conditions apply.

■ Teacher Loan Forgiveness:

You must teach full-time for five complete and consecutive academic years in certain schools and educational service agencies that serve low-income families, and meet other qualifications, to be eligible for forgiveness of up to a combined total of \$17,500 on your Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans and your Subsidized and Unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loans

Minimum gpa, appropriate major, and other factors may be required for eligibility
