## William Paterson University Transfer Policy

- If you have AA/AS degree from a Community College, you need to complete only one WI and Foreign Language requirement in addition to your major requirements.
- Courses must be similar in scope, content, and academic rigor to courses offered at William Paterson University.
- William Paterson University may require a review of the syllabus and textbook(s) used for the course.
- Only college level courses completed with a grade of "C" or better based on 4.0 grade scale will be considered for transfer credit.
- The last 30 credits for the baccalaureate degree must be taken at William Paterson University.
- No more than half of the credits required for a major will be accepted as transfer credit.
- Evaluated courses and the credit awarded for each course are listed on an official William Paterson University transcript.

    - Recommendation of suspension or expulsion from the University


