## Faculty and Staff Quick Guide

### Emergency Numbers

For emergencies call **911**

Also, program the William Paterson University Police Department into your phone: **973.720.2300**

Record your emergency contacts on paper in case your cell phone becomes unavailable.

If you see something, say something.

### Shelter in Place Alerts

Shelter in place is a request made by campus authorities when moving around campus puts your safety in jeopardy—possibly due to violent acts on campus, hazardous material spills, or other situations.

#### Know your classroom/office:

Where are the exits? Does the door lock?

Depending on your particular location or situation, consider these actions:

- **Lock or blockade doors (use chair or doorstop)**
- **Turn out lights**
- **Hide in closet or enclosed area**
- **Stay quiet**
- **Silence your cell phone**
- **Get informed about the situation**
- **Check in with others via text or email**
- **Look for University updates via text, phone, email or social media**

### Emergency Alerts

Emergency alerts are sent primarily through the WPUNJ Alert system via phone (voice/text), email, Facebook, Twitter, and posted on the University home page.

For faculty, make sure at least one person in the classroom leaves a cell phone turned on to receive WPUNJ Alerts.

Make sure to sign up for emergency alerts via the link <https://wpconnect.wpunj.edu/portal/employee/> and search for Emergency Notification Setup. Update your information as needed.
