

## Meeting minutes, Senate Budget and Planning Council, February 14, 2023

### Item 1: Fiscal Priorities

de Veyga: Top priority of administration is to narrow budget "hole" assuming no major changes in state budgeting (up or down)

Estimate for budget hole, at November numbers: \$12-14M.

Changes in budget office were discussed. Don Bennett retired- Baldwin on leave until ~May. Fiscal analyst Loewrigkeit tendered resignation. Steve Bolyai was a temporary sub to assist in carry over. Kirsten Loewrigkeit will handle budget and WdV will handle enrollment management.

Continued discussion of Budget Office changes; shortage of carryover in staff under new CFO will continue to be a challenge.

Council question: how is the institution planning to deal with ongoing loss of talent in the budget office?

De Veyga: look it as an opportunity, and opportunity to learn for better personnel management in the future.

Council: Is there a reimagining of positions that are involved in turnover?

Sometimes necessary especially in areas with extreme turnover like Enrollment Management

Q: Are our workers given opportunities to grow?

A (de Veyga): We post internally, but what we're doing is also challenging.

Q: Are our salaries competitive?

A (de Veyga): Union steps and ranges are fairly consistent even across institutions  
Noted that movement from one title/range to another is possible to maintain competitive wages.

It's important to be aware if people are taking jobs at higher scales elsewhere

Q: Does loss of talent impact workforce implementation?

A: Yes

Item 2: Discussion of Student Enrollment

Based on President's address: Enrollment questions-

What is the "good news" that RH's address?

A: We hit enrollment targets for first time in some time

Goal overall 9095 for Spring

Enrollment numbers from Census 1 and estimates for Census 2 were discussed. All numbers from Census 1 available as spreadsheet (attached as addendum to the minutes).

George Hacenga official start date is 2/27 as new VP for Budget

Council Question: Can we see changes in budget due to faculty cuts?

Answer (de Veyga): It is dependent on Kirsten Loewrigkeit's work when she starts.

Question: Can we invite Kirsten Loewrigkeit to our March meeting?

Answer: we can invite her, she will probably be amenable.

Question: Does the Bloomfield takeover impact us? It's interesting question but we have more concern about NJCU, or larger schools since Bloomfield is only 1100 students.

Comment: MSU and WPU are very similar in admissions percentage... what are the differences in enrollment outcomes?
